Phrase: A phrase is a group of words which does not make complete sense.

- Ex: in the east for his courage
- at the bus stop with love and care
- on his success about my success

Ex: The Sun rises in the east.

Madhavi was waiting at the bus stop.

I congratulated Madhu on her success.

He was praised for his courage.

Sailaja was brought up with love and care.

Madhavi was very happy about my success.

1. **Adjective Phrase**: A group of words which does the work of
an adjective is called an Adjective Phrase.

Ex: with his wife and children

in white dress

with a powerful army

with long hair

The man with wife and children is my uncle.

The girl in white dress is my elder sister.

The king with a powerful army tried to defeat his enemy.

I love girls with long hair.

2. **Adverb Phrase:** A group of words which does the work of an adverb is called an Adverb Phrase.

Ex: with great speed in a very rude manner

without any care at this very moment

on this spot in all directions

in those days

Ex: He was driving the car with great speed.

He jumped into the sea without any care.

The accident took place on this spot.

She frequently went to the temple in those days.

Madhavi spoke to me in a very rude manner.

I can pay the amount to you at this very moment.

The news of Sudha Rani's elopement spread in all directions.

3. **Noun Phrase**: A group of words which does the work of a noun is called a Noun Phrase.

Ex: early to bed

reading books

to win the race

playing cricket

teaching English

smoking cigars

Ex: *Early to bed* is a good habit.

Reading books gives us knowledge and pleasure.

I love *teaching English*.

My friend likes *playing cricket.*

Raju hates *smoking cigars.*

He has a strong desire *to win the race.*
